




UHEAA's low student loan default rates










How do students pay for college?










How the typical family pays for college





Pell Grants – Largest Federal student aid grant program

- Utah students significant users of Pell Grant
- Pell Grants based on financial need for undergraduate study
- Maximum award: \$5,730
- 12 semesters
- Total Utah Pell for 2012-13:

119,800 students \$421 million

 Up to 30 credit hours for remedial coursework











Pell Grant recipients in Utah

Award Years 2000-2013













Pell Grant dollars in Utah






Pell & Loan use in Utah: Twice as much loan volume compared to Pell

■ Pell Grants











Federal student loan volume in Utah








Student loan and Pell Grant dollar volume at Utah schools










Student debt surpasses all other nonmortgage debt









Post-recession reality: Decreased parental support for paying college expenses

- Student loan debt is the only kind of household debt that continued to rise during the recession.
- Parents' average out-of-pocket spending for college expenses has decreased by 35% since 2010.

50% of Utah graduates have loans

Utah average student loan debt of college seniors ranks 44th in nation at \$21,520.

National average is \$29,400.



Example monthly payment amount

- \$21,520 balance
- 6% interest rate
- 10-year repayment period

Monthly payment = \$239

Annual income of \$36,000 needed to service this debt level.










Reality of borrowing patterns

Press stories of extremely high debt levels are the exception.

40% of borrowers have balances less than \$10,000

3.7% of borrowers have balances greater than \$100,000











Need-based, state grant aid



Utah ranks 48th in state need-based grant dollars per undergraduate FTE.¹
